## **Ban on XL Bully Dog Breeds**

The transition period for owners of XL Bully dog breeds began on 14<sup>th</sup> November 2023.

During the transition period, which runs until 31 January 2024, owners who wish to keep their dogs must apply to an exemption scheme. Applications for exemption certificates are now open.

Following a concerning rise in attacks and fatalities caused by XL Bully dogs, the government has added this breed to the list of dogs banned under the Dangerous Dogs Act 1991.

## From **31 December 2023** it will be against the law to:

- sell an XL Bully dog
- abandon an XL Bully dog or let it stray
- give away an XL Bully dog
- breed from an XL Bully dog
- · have an XL Bully in public without a lead and muzzle

From **1 February 2024** it will be a criminal offence to own an XL Bully dog in England and Wales unless your dog has a Certificate of Exemption.
