Food support and cookery resources for families

Since the Covid-19 pandemic, Lewisham Council has provided families who receive Free School Meals with £15 weekly vouchers during school holidays to help tackle holiday hunger. These vouchers have been funded through the UK Government's Household Support Fund.

The previous UK Government was due to end its Household Support Fund in September 2024. While the council will continue to provide holiday vouchers during the summer holidays, it cannot currently commit to continuing the scheme beyond this point, when government funding is due to end, and no extension / replacement has been committed to by the new government.

We know that school holidays put particular pressure on family budgets and that the end of these vouchers will have a direct impact on low-income households. That's why we are sharing a list of resources to help families who need a bit of extra help during the holidays below. Food support

Lewisham Foodbank, run by The Trussell Trust, can provide food parcels to families in need. You must have a voucher before you can collect a food parcel. To get a voucher, please contact an organisation that supports you, like a school, housing association, social worker, Citizens Advice, GP or faith organisation. Each voucher can only be used once, and you can have **up to** six vouchers in six months. A list of foodbank locations is available at lewisham.foodbank.org.uk/locations/.
