

2011 Census First Release Outputs 16 July 2012

The Office for National Statistics (ONS) today released the first outputs from the 2011 Census, giving a total population figure for Lewisham at 275,900 (as of Census day, 27 March 2011). This means that Lewisham is the fourth largest Inner London borough in terms of population size and the 12<sup>th</sup> largest in Greater London

Additionally the full release provides Local Authorities with the following figures:

- population breakdown by gender and five year age band<sup>1</sup>
- number of households with at least one usual resident
- number of residents living in a communal establishment<sup>2</sup>
- number of non-UK short-term residents by gender<sup>3</sup>

The 2011 Census response rate for Lewisham was 88%, this is an increase of 7% compared to 2001.

The total population figure of 275,900 is a 3.5% increase on the 2010 ONS Mid Year Population Estimate for Lewisham. It is also a 10.8% increase on the 2001 Census population. London's total population figure according to the 2011 Census is 8,173,900 a 14.0% increase since 2001.

Table 2 shows the borough's population by broad age band. The proportion of Lewisham's population aged 0-19 at 25.4% is slightly higher than the England average of 24.0%. However, those aged 0-4 make up 8.0% of Lewisham's population but only 6.3% of England's. The borough is home to more than 5,000 more female residents than males, however this gender gap is actually a reduction compared to 2001 where there were almost 9,000 more females. This gender balance is predominantly comprised of those 65 and over.

Table 3 illustrates the biggest growth has been seen in the number of younger people since the 2010 Mid Year Estimates. The older population is actually lower in 2011 than 2001, despite an overall increase in total population, however this latest figure is higher than the estimate given for mid-2010.

The number of households within the borough has grown by 8,704 since 2001. This represents a 8.1% increase.
