Community Centre set to be high street hub

The Sydenham Centre is to feature a vibrant mix of local organisations

Now the mosaic on the Sydenham Centre is a familiar sight, the space inside the building is to become a vibrant community asset too. Along with hosting existing users, the new Community Centre will feature a mix of local organisations including Sydenham Arts, SEE3, Sydenham Film Club and activities focussed around dance and physical movement, including pilates and yoga. This welcoming public space will initially be managed by Lewisham's Community

Premises team, with a range of voluntary and community organisations based there to ensure that a user friendly and inclusive environment is created. Its future use will be discussed at the Sydenham Assembly meeting at 7.30pm on Thursday 17 September at the TNG in Wells Park Road.

Station approach toilet yet to be occupied

The toilet at station approach is yet to be opened, despite increasing pressure from the Assembly. In October 2014 the old blocks were demolished, with new units delivered in February. But the toilets still need to be fitted to the water meter and are currently not visually appealing.

The Council says: Let's talk rubbish

The Council will be making major changes to waste and recycling collections next year and it wants to know what you think about the options.

There will be a number of drop in sessions in the libraries for those who don't have access to a computer and the results will be posted online and in Lewisham Life later in the year.

Councillor Rachel Onikosi, Cabinet Member for the Public Realm, said: "We have done really well in Lewisham over the years to avoid sending waste to landfill. We sent just 0.3% to landfill last year saving millions of pounds in taxes and charges and avoiding the most environmentally damaging way of disposing of waste. But we could be recycling a lot more."
