Royal visit for community bus project

The Duke and Duchess of Cambridge visited Hazel Grove youth scheme

The Duke and Duchess of Cambridge visited Hazel Grove estate in March to see the work carried out by the XLP community bus project.

The project aims to support young people with difficulties who are likely to become involved in antisocial activities and gangs. Friendly youth workers operating from the bus offer a range of dropin and learning support



sessions for young people to help them make wise life-style choices and

complete their education. Cllr Chris Best presented the royal couple with the Hazel Grove Intergenerational Project album as a memento of their visit. She said: "It was a proud

moment to present the album and talk about the community spirit in Sydenham."

Greyhound on track



Building work has finally resumed on the Greyhound pub.

A programme of work has been agreed between the Council and developer Purelake that includes carrying out repair works. A new roof will be constructed and windows installed to ensure the building becomes weatherproof.

Purelake has said it will clear the external areas so that they are "neat and tidy".

The council said that it would keep a close eye on progress to ensure the latest agreement is honoured.

Bakerloo line extension

Analysis of last year's consultation by TfL on the Bakerloo line extension to Beckenham Junction and Hayes showed that 65 and 68 per cent of respondents from Lewisham and Bromley, respectively, supported the scheme. As usual the crucial issue will be funding and further public consultation is expected to occur in 2016. Bus countdown sign

Summer festival returns to Sydenham



Sydenham Arts has confirmed plans for its seventh annual Summer Festival. Taking place on 4-12 July, the nine day celebrations will allow residents the opportunity to discover the arts on their doorstep.

Events will kick off with an American themed Fourth of July Street Celebration on the high street.

The American celebration will continue with the South London Jazz Orchestras Big Band Night, as they perform big band classics alongside more modern numbers at St Barts Church. This will be followed by a free Open Air Screening of one of America's screen classics The Wizard of Oz in Mayow Park. Music, comedy, drama and spoken

Take the Artist's trail

This year's Artist's Trail will take place across two weekends in July - 4th-5th July and 11th-12th July - from 11am to 5pm. Over 100 artists



will be taking part once again, with new talent included again this year. Last year artists in Honor Oak Park and Penge joined forces with the Sydenham and Forest Hill artists, bringing even more visitors to the trail.

Local artists with a wide range of skills will be displaying their work, which will include fine art, prints, photography, ceramics, glass, textiles, jewellery, and sculptures.

- Festival in the Forest: Folk, Irish, Country Rock and Bluegrass on Sunday 5th July in the tranquil setting of the Devonshire Road Nature Reserve
- Itchy Teeth will curate Itchy Toothpicks, a showcase of bands on Friday 10th July at Livesey Hall.
