Road Safety — Westwood Hill

Sydenham schools, parents and residents have raised concerns regarding road safety along Westwood Hill particularly outside Sydenham High school. Lewisham are currently advertising for a new school crossing patrol officer to help ensure safety pre and post school and we are keen to fill the role as soon as possible. Current safety measures outside the school include speed cameras and a pedestrian refuge. We are currently in discussions with TFL about what other safety measures they could introduce.



Waste and recycling

Weekly garden waste collections

Since its launch in February, the new garden waste service has over 6000 sign ups. It is not too late to sign up to the garden waste service, residents should call 020 8314-9756 or register online.

What to put in recycling bins?

There appears much confusion about what items should go in the recycling (green) bin (if you are a resident that has one). The following items are accepted recycling material: paper, card,



glass, tins and plastics. Clothes, shoes and other textile materials are not accepted in residential bins. These items can be taken to the textiles bank on Sydenham Road junction with Porthcawe Road, Sydenham. For further information on any recycling questions or issues go to www.lewisham.gov.uk/myservices/wasterecycle/

Residents can also take their recycling waste to the Recycling and Re-use centre, Landmann Way, Lewisham. No pre-booking required and it's a free service.

Mattress collections are free, book online or call 020 8314 7171.

Fly-tipping — This is a serious issue within Lewisham. The bulky collection service offers to collect three big items for £15, a widely used service. It is unfortunately a small minority of residents that throw their waste out on the streets. Fly-tipping is a criminal offence and those caught could be fined, summoned to court and/or imprisoned. We need to continue working together to reduce fly-tipping in Sydenham by collecting information about the perpetrators. Greyhound

The Asset of Community Value (ACV) process which allowed for interested parties to submit a bid to purchase the pub closed on 28th April. A commercial operator is currently in negotiation with the owners to potentially run the pub. We look forward to a final opening as quickly as possible.

London Wildlife Trust

Glad to announce that the London Wildlife Trust have submitted a bid to the Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF) for the natural restoration of various woodland sites. If succesful the Trust are interested in delivering the Great North Wood project which could include Sydenham's Hillcrest Estate nature reserve. Come and hear from the London Wildlife Trust on the 30th July.

• EU Referedum

The result of the EU referedum revealed that Britain will be exiting its long-standing membership with the European Union. Conversely, results across London saw a strong vote for remain. In particular, Lewisham revealed that out of the 63% of residents that voted, 69.9% voted for the UK to remain in Europe. The UK Government is now preparing its exit and we will better understand the impact of leaving the EU as the exit strategy and future national policies are prepared.

Conservation in Sydenham

Many residents have asked questions about planning permission, so please see the summary below. Please however always check with the Council before you embark on changes to your premises.

There are conservation areas within Sydenham, specifically Cobbs Corner, the Thorpes, Jews Walk and Sydenham Road west of Mayow Road. These areas in particular require formal planning consent for work such as rear extensions, loft conversions, new roofing and new windows, erecting, altering or removing a chimney, vehicle crossovers, installing a satellite dish to the front, rendering or cladding the exterior, pollarding or cutting down trees. In these areas work carried out without permission could result in enforcement action against you by the Council. Current planning in Sydenham

We understand that there is interest in the Greyhound pub - see News In Brief.

Sainsbury's Local opened in March & the second retail unit, temporarily occupied by Sydenham Beds, is under offer.

The commercial unit below the new Orb Apartments at 278-280 Kirkdale has been sold on. Work has begun on the site at 22a-24 Sydenham Road for new homes and a commercial unit. Another major development "in the pipeline" is the former Regency Club (Cobbs Corner site fronting Kirkdale & Spring Hill). The new owners are exploring options, potentially retail units on the ground floor and offices above. Connaught Leisure at 96a Sydenham Road is increasingly unsightly so we are hoping that a planning application will shortly be submitted for a new development

Other developments at varying stages

- A planning application has been lodged for the rebuilding of St Philip Neri R.C Primary School to accommodate infant pupils. Nearby residents are concerned about increased car traffic and air pollution.
- An application for a residential scheme at 154-156 Sydenham Road (the O'Rourke's site) has caused some concern amongst nearby residents in relation to proximity of site to their



homes and the blocking of natural light.

- A revised planning application for the site at 138 Sydenham Road junction with Knighton Park Road saw residents raise strong objections at a community meeting on 19th May.
- A planning application for the development of a block of six 2-bedroom flats to the front of 5 Churchley Villas, a site which borders the Longton Nursery Allotments. As access would be via an unadopted road, there are concerns about parking, highway safety and overdevelopment of a particularly sensitive site.
