

Healthy Neighbourhood

The Healthy Neighbourhood programme aims to make Lewisham's diverse communities greener, healthier and a more attractive place to live, work, play and study. By restricting traffic that presently uses residential streets to avoid main roads it will reduce congestion in your neighbourhood, improve air quality and make the local area more pleasant to walk and cycle through.

The programme will start in 'East Sydenham', the area between Forest Hill, Sydenham and Lower Sydenham stations, and includes the Bell Green retail park (Sainsburys). (See the map below).

In the first stage of the programme, residents will be able to access local traffic data to share their views on traffic issues. They will be able to help in identifying schemes to address them, on www. streetbuilder.io/eastsydenham/site/faq and at a series of public events and workshops. The second stage will see trials of proposed traffic management measures for a period from 6 to 18 months, so that we can monitor their impact, gather local opinion and



assess whether to make any changes permanent.

You can get involved at the Co-design workshops Tuesday 17 September, 4.00pm to 7.00pm, and Saturday 21 September from 1.30pm to 4.30pm. Both events are at Sydenham Community Library, 210 Sydenham Rd, SE26 5SE

Bell Green Masterplan

The Bell Green retail park has been identified by Lewisham Council as a site for future housing development. Opportunities to improve the area include better public transport, trees and landscape improvements, repair and refurbishment of historic

New Neighbourhood Forum for Sydenham Hill?

Lewisham Council is consulting with Southwark Council on an application to designate the Sydenham Hill Ridge as a neighbourhood area and forum.

A statutory 6 week public consultation will run from the 5 September - 31 October 2019 and you are invited to share your views on the application. 

In June Sydenham Safer Neighbourhood Team (SNT) launched the inaugural #together community event at St Bartholomew's primary school. Thanks to the school for hosting, and all those who were involved. We aim to hold another one in the Spring.

A prolific shoplifter was caught and charged with 9 offences, and sentenced to 20 weeks in prison. Teamwork and engagement with the local shops, facilitated this.

In July, we assisted with the relaunch of Beckenham Place Park which was attended by Mayor Sadiq Khan and local councillors.

For any fly tipping concerns informing the council is the best way to get the problem dealt with quickly and efficiently. Report any witnessing of fly tipping at www.lewisham.gov.uk/reportflytippers or at www.lewisham.gov.uk/reportflytipping for non-witnessed fly tips. You can call 0208 314 2170 or email cleansingenforcement@lewisham.gov.uk You can also download the *Fix my Street* App to easily report these offences or graffiti and flyposting directly to the department. Offences reported in this way are usually cleared within 48 hours.

If you have large items to dispose of you can do so at the Lewisham dump in New Cross. If more convenient you can use the recycling centres in Bromley www.bromley.gov.uk for £3 or Bexley www.bexley.gov.uk for £10.
