Lewisham Foodbank is part

of the Trussell Trust, a nationwide network of foodbanks. We opened in 2012 and have four distribution centres including one in Forest Hill, as well as an office in Sydenham. Last year we gave away 2,500 food parcels to people who had been referred to us because they were in crisis. All the food we give out has been donated to us.

We are a registered charity with over 60 volunteers that help to collect, sort and distribute food. We also direct people to other help and take time to listen and care. Please come see us if you'd like to volunteer or just want to know more.

Lola, Jana, Melissa, Ella, Biba and Lauren, with their team colleagues at Dulwich College, have developed an innovative chopping board that cleverly solves the perennial kitchen problem of separating prepared food from waste. Their "ChopAway" board has a detachable bowl to catch food waste for easy disposal, and fits neatly over the edge of any worktop. Its non-slip feet prevent movement.
