
Last chance to have your say on how we spend it!

Boundaries review

The Local Government Boundary Commission has reviewed the electoral boundaries within Lewisham for the first time since 1999. They have proposed that as of 2022, the local government elections in Lewisham will have 54 councillors representing 19 wards (there are currently 18 wards). Under this proposal, a small area of Bellingham will join Sydenham, which otherwise remains unchanged. CPZ Zones

The council is considering the introduction of a new Controlled Parking Zone (CPZ) in Sydenham. Officers will be meeting with councillors early in the New Year to discuss draft boundaries, after which a design process will be undertaken. This will then go out for consultation in the Spring. We hope to bring you an update at the Spring Assembly (date tbc).

St Philip Neri School

A planning enforcement notice was issued by Lewisham on 25th October 2019 following the refusal of a planning application seeking to address the non-compliances at OLSPN School. The School has notified Lewisham that they intend to lodge an appeal which will likely be heard at a Public Inquiry in mid-2020. Local Residents will be notified by Lewisham of the appeal when it is formally filed by the Planning Inspectorate.



A new gardening project was initiated in memory of James Ross Hunter, to provide a platform for young people to learn how to grow their own fruits, vegetables and herbs, and create a calming space where young and old can come together.

East Sydenham Healthy Neighbourhood (HN)

The Healthy Neighbourhood programme is aimed at encouraging walking and cycling for shorter journeys across the borough with a view to enhancing air quality, tackling congestion and improving road safety. In line with Lewisham's Transport Strategy the aim is to reduce Lewisham's carbon emissions to net zero by 2030. The initial consultation stage for East Sydenham HN is now closed. Officers are working hard on the implementation of the trial period. This will involve temporary road closures (modal filters) which will be closely monitored to assess their impact. If you would like to know more and how this may affect your journeys, please come to the Assembly to put your questions to our Healthy Neighbourhood Team.
