
## **Spontaneous**


### **Productions**

## Latest on Our Lady and St Philip Neri School

The conclusion of the independent Planning Inquiry found that contractors for the Archdiocese of Southwark failed to comply with planning consent given in 2016 to build the new school. As construction took place, it became clear that the building varied considerably from the granted planning permission. A number of public meetings were held with local residents, the Sydenham Society and councillors to find a solution. The Archdiocese submitteda section 73 application that would allow the builder to vary the agreed conditions but this was refused by the Council in October 2019 and a Planning Enforcement Notice was issued. The Archdiocese appealed this decision and the enforcement notice but lost and their appeal was dismissed. Lewisham Council are now in discussion with the Archdiocese on the next steps to take.



### **Friends of Home Park**

Building on the success of the previous Friends of Home Park (FOHP), the new committee has been busy! Volunteers have been out litter picking and planting by the library piazza. They are actively planning events for the local community, working on creating a café and/or having an ice cream van in the park. FOHP are also working with the Council's parks officer, in the hope of obtaining funding to purchase orchards, trees, benches and new bins. They, additionally, have a long term plan to raise funds for a new playground. If you would like to attend the next meeting it is

## Sydenham Hill

The planning permission granted to The City of London Corporation (CoL) to redevelop part of the Sydenham Hill Estate has been guashed.

It would seem that the planning committee was not given the full extent of the harm the proposed four, six and seven-storey buildings would do to the heritage of the listed buildings and the conservation area in the surrounding area.

The Friends of Mais House have been campaigning for a more sensitive development and were behind the Judicial Review that challenged the permission to provide the 110 residential units.

#### SNT

The recent ward panel gave SNT a new focus, driven by the demands of residents. SNT is targeting anti-social behaviour on e-scooters and looking to deter thieves of catalytic converters through their patrols.

Ward panels meet every three months, and are always looking for new members. If you would like to help drive the priorities of your ward, please get in touch to join.
