The following tables set out what information **must** be submitted with your application to be made valid and what information may be required. If an application is submitted without meeting these requirements it will not be made valid and you will be informed that you have 21 days to provide the necessary information before it is withdrawn.

The Council does not negotiate on applications for lawful development certificates (proposed), so will consider what has been submitted as valid on receipt and proceed to determine it on that basis.

Duty Planner Service

The Council offers a duty planner service through which you can discuss your proposals, including validation requirements, with a planning officer and receive written advice prior to the submission of an application. Further details can be found on our website [here](#).

Certificate of Lawfulness (Proposed) for...

- ... the construction of a single-storey rear extension at X address, together with the insertion of a ground floor window to the side elevation.
- ... the construction of a hip to gable roof extension at X address.
- ... the construction of an extension to the rear roof slope of X address.
- ... the construction of an outbuilding in the rear garden of X address.
- ... the change of use of X address from X use to X use.
