

FOOD WASTE

Love your food - good for the planet, and for your purse

Producing food to eat requires a lot of energy and water, so by reducing food waste we can reduce our carbon footprint. Saving food means saving money. There, all computers will be wiped of their data to a professional standard. Volunteers will repair computers if necessary so they can be loaned out at the library.
