# **NCIL Fund**

Lewisham Council is set to open two funding programmes this month: Ward NCIL and the 2022-25 Main Grants Programme. Nearly £3 million in funding through the Neighbourhood Community Infrastructure Levy (NCIL) Fund is focussed on improving infrastructure and meeting needs resulting from increased development in an area. Sydenham Ward's NCIL priorities were agreed on in January 2020. They are: transport and streets; open/ green spaces and nature; community safety; air quality; community facilities and community health and wellbeing. A total of £88,084 will be available for projects benefiting residents of Sydenham. The Council will also be launching a new Main Grants Programme with £7 million in funding available over the next 3 years for community groups across Lewisham. Successful applicants will need to address the following themes: an economically sound future; a healthy and well future; and a future we all have a part in. 



### Artist open call

As part of London's *Borough of Culture*, Lewisham Council are looking for two artists, or artists collectives, to be at the heart of the Council for 6 months, working closely with Counterpoints Arts. ### Affordable homes

Construction has begun on 11 new genuinely affordable homes at Brasted Close, Sydenham.

These will be available for purchase well below the market rate. London Community Land Trust are inviting applicants to apply for six 2-bedroom, three person homes priced at £272,500. There are also five 1-bedroom, 2 person homes priced at £215,000. To be eligible you need to have lived in Lewisham for at least 5 years (preference is given to those in Sydenham and Forest Hill) and be able to demonstrate housing need and be able to obtain a mortgage.
